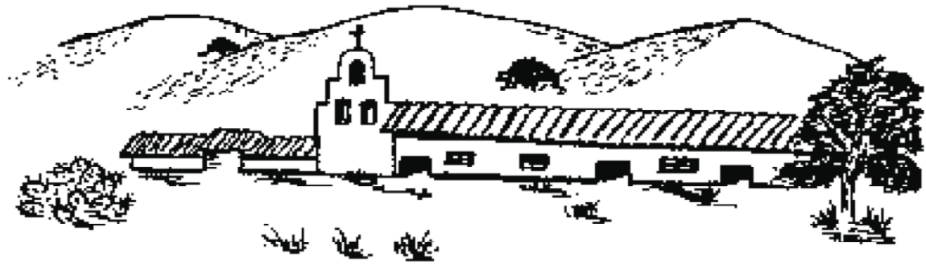

PRO-LIFE

SPEND A MINUTE-SAVE LIVES AND RIGHTS

The California legislature recently concluded its session and has sent hundreds of bills to Governor Jerry Brown for his signature. Once signed, the bills become California law. Among the bills are several that require all pro-lifers to actively oppose. You can make your objections to these anti-life bills known by calling Governor Brown's office at 916-445-2841. Simply tell the staffer who answers that you want the governor to veto SB 743, AB 569, and SB 481. The call will take only one minute of your time but will send a powerful message that citizens will hold politicians accountable for anti-life legislation.

Oppose SB 734- More Dollars for Abortion Industry

Unhappily, California leads the nation in unrestricted access to abortion and contraceptive services. Now the state legislature has passed a bill which will lead to higher Medi-Cal reimbursement rates for abortion providers despite the lack of funding for other needy Californians.

Oppose AB 569- Restricts Religious Employers' Ability to Enforce Code of Conduct for Reproductive Health

AB 569 deliberately targets religious employers by denying the freedom of churches and schools to ask employees to model the principles of their faith. Couched under "anti-discrimination" language, AB 569 does not allow religious employers to enforce a code of conduct with respect to reproductive health and extends to employees' family members as well.

SB 481 Oppose-

Allows nursing homes without any other oversight, to declare patients unfit to make their own decisions, and then implement 'medical procedures' which may include ending their life by a denial of fluids. This is very similar to a bill making its way through the Oregon legislature. In that state it is SB 494, allowing conscious people to be euthanized without their consent via intentional dehydration.

Once your call to Governor Brown's office is complete, take another minute and call your US Representative and senators. Ask them to support HR 644. The phone numbers are on page 5 of this newsletter. (Editor's note: The phone numbers were not received).

Support HR 644- The Conscience Protection Act (CPA)

HR 644 is much-needed, common-sense legislation which will clarify federal law and ensure that those who provide health care and health coverage can continue to do so without being forced by government to help destroy innocent unborn children. Please take a moment to let your representatives in Congress know that we expect them to protect our most cherished liberties.
